South Oxfordshire Local Plan Sustainability Appraisal

1. Introduction

- South Oxfordshire District Council (the Council) has appointed Amec Foster Wheeler Environment and Infrastructure UK Ltd (Amec Foster Wheeler) to provide assistance with the Sustainability Appraisal (SA), incorporating Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA), of its Local Plan.
- The SA Report and Appendices to accompany the Publication version of the Local Plan were provided to the Council on 12th September. Following meetings of the Scrutiny Committee and Cabinet to consider the plan and supporting documentation, further amendments have been made and proposed in a resolution (dated 21st September). The purpose of this Technical Note is to consider the implications for the SA of the proposed amendments and to provide further appraisal (as necessary) to ensure that all policies in the Publication version of the Local Plan have been subject to SA/SEA.
- 1.1.3 In summary the changes proposed are:
 - ▶ An update to Policy DES8 'Efficient use of resources' with additional text added in relation to higher quality and higher density development which minimises land take. Amendments are also proposed to the supporting text around the optimisation of density and the need to take into account townscape character and a range of other factors, including the character and appearance of Conservation Areas and the Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty;
 - A new policy on the Green Belt, STRAT11. This includes removal of land from the Green Belt at Wheatley
 - ▶ The self build target in Policy H12 is increased from 2% to 3%.
 - Changes to supporting text in relation to planning for larger villages and the potential of development being delivered on land adjacent the Culham Science Centre in advance of the planned transport infrastructure.
- 1.1.4 This note also provides an update in relation to the Habitats Regulations Assessment and how that should be referenced in the SA.
- Implications of the proposed changes for the SA
- 2.1.1 The proposed changes and their implications for the SA are discussed below.
- 2.2 The Proposed Amendment to Policy DES8
- Policy DES8 is appraised in Appendix P of the SA Report. The proposed amendment would improve the performance of the policy against SA objective 8, which relates to improving the efficiency of land use. The current SA records no relationship between the Policy and this objective. If the change is made this should be amended to a significant positive effect on the basis that the amendment would help optimise density on sites. The policy has included mitigation

September 2017 Doc Ref: 39402R004i1 through reference in the supporting text to the provision of "overriding reasons concerning townscape, character, landscape, design or infrastructure capacity". This would also be acknowledged in the main report (section 8.3 of the main report discusses likely significant effects associated with the policies). A minor positive effect would also be identified in relation to SA Objective 9 relating to 'built heritage' as the supporting text to the policy highlights the need to take into account townscape character and Conservation Areas. No other changes to the SA matrix are considered necessary. No changes to the policy are suggested as a result of the SA.

2.3 New Policy on the Green Belt STRAT11

- This policy reflects the National Planning Policy Framework in respect of the protection of the Green Belt. It also proposes a change to the Green Belt at Wheatley to support the village and the ambitions for growth contained in their Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP). Development proposals for Wheatley would need to be in accordance with the policies and provision of the Wheatley NDP. The new policy STRAT11, including the proposed amendment to the boundary at Wheatley, has been appraised against the SA objectives (Table 2.1) and, if the change is made to the policy, the matrix for the STRAT policies at Appendix P of the SA Report would be updated to include the appraisal.
- The inclusion of a general policy in relation to the Green Belt is anticipated to have a range of potential significant positive effects, for example in relation to SA objective 8 relating to land use as it would help to conserve the district's open spaces and countryside. It could also contribute to a significant positive effect in relation to SA objective 9 relating to built heritage, e.g. by helping to protect the setting of heritage features within the Green Belt. Retaining land in the Green Belt could have a role in maintaining the flood plain and permeable surfaces within the district and a significant positive effect is therefore identified for SA objective 11 (flood risk).
- Uncertain effects are identified in relation to a range of other objectives on the basis that any development in the Green Belt that requires planning permission may need to demonstrate very special circumstances.
- The proposal to amend the Green Belt by releasing land at Wheatley has a range of significant effects, both positive and negative. It could lead to positive effects associated with the provision of housing (SA objective 1) but the scale of provision is uncertain at this stage. Wheatley has a range of existing services that new development could utilise so the potential for significant positive effects are identified for SA objectives 4 (health) and 6 (travel choice). It could lead to the loss of greenfield land but also result in the redevelopment of previously developed land, so a mixed score is identified for SA objective 8 relating to land use.
- The potential for significant negative effects are identified for SA objective 11 (flood risk) because the area that is proposed to be included in the revised inset for Wheatley includes land in Flood Zone 3.

Mitigation

- lt is suggested that the policy could be amended to reflect the NPPF (paragraph 81), i.e. to identify opportunities for beneficial use of the Green Belt:
- "Once Green Belts have been defined, local planning authorities should plan positively to enhance the beneficial use of the Green Belt, such as looking for opportunities to provide access; to provide opportunities for outdoor sport and recreation; to retain and enhance landscapes, visual amenity and biodiversity; or to improve damaged and derelict land."
- With regard to flood risk at Wheatley, Policies DES1 'Delivering High Quality Development,' DES4 'Masterplans for Allocated Sites and Major Developments' and DES8 'Promoting Sustainable Design' would mitigate the likelihood of flooding through requiring developments to be well designed and resilient to the effects of climate change and reduce risk of surface water flooding (1 in 30 year extent). It is also assumed that any proposals coming through the NDP would need to address these issues and would also be assessed through the SA of the NDP.

- 2.4 Policy H12 Self Build and Custom Build Housing
- As noted above the self build target in Policy H12 is proposed to be increased from 2% to 3% in order to promote this as a route to home ownership.
- Policy H12 is assessed in Appendix P of the SA. Given the strategic nature of the SA objectives it is not considered that amending the target from 2% to 3% would impact on the results of the SA of the policy. Nor would it affect any of the significant differences identified for the two policy alternatives. The SA Report will be updated to acknowledge this amendment.
- 2.5 Changes to Supporting Text
- The proposed changes to supporting text in relation to planning for larger villages and the potential of development being delivered on land adjacent the Culham Science Centre in advance of the planned transport infrastructure are not considered to impact on the SA.
- 2.6 Habitats Regulations Assessment
- The HRA of the South Oxfordshire Submission Local Plan (September 2017) has been undertaken by Land Use Consultants. The SA Report needs to be updated to include reference to the report as it must also consider the potential for likely significant effects in relation to European designated sites.
- Although the HRA has concluded that the Local Plan alone will not have a significant air pollution impact, at this stage it has not been possible to conclude the Appropriate Assessment of air pollution impacts arising from the Local Plan in combination with other plans or projects. These impacts relate to potential increases in traffic on the following roads within 200 metres of sensitive European sites:
 - M40: Aston Rowant SAC;
 - A355: Burnham Beeches SAC;
 - A404 & A4010: Chilterns Beechwoods SAC; and
 - A332 & A329: Windsor Forest & Great Park SAC.
- Conclusion of the assessment requires guidance from Natural England, which is currently being updated following the recent Wealden Judgement. It is expected that Natural England's advice will be received during the forthcoming consultation period. LUC will therefore aim to make use of the consultation period by liaising with Natural England in order to reach an agreement on the assessment before the Local Plan is submitted to the Planning Inspectorate.
- The SA, including the potential for consideration of cumulative effects needs to be updated to reflect this conclusion and the outcome of subsequent discussions with Natural England.
