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In order to be able to continue to preserve and maintain our local services the precept requirement of Chinnor Parish Council for the year 2022/2023 is **£ 357,306** which is based upon the estimate of expenditure as set out below

Unlike the larger District and County Councils the Parish Council receives no funding from Central Government or Business Rates, so the net cost of our services is funded entirely from the council tax payers of Chinnor.

The small element of your council tax which comes our way, based on a Band D property equates to £ 121.69 per annum which is £2.34 per week an amount that has not increased for the past 5 years.

The Parish Council promotes the interests of Chinnor in its representations to other bodies and works in partnership with the District Council, County Council and other agencies to provide and supplement local government services within Chinnor. The Parish Council is consulted on all planning applications made in respect of properties in Chinnor and written representations are submitted.

Meetings of the Parish Council are open to the press and public and all meetings are publicised on the Parish Council's notice boards and web site – www.chinnorparishcouncil.gov.uk. There is an opportunity for members of the public to raise any comments or queries that they have with the Parish Council. It is helpful if you contact us prior to attending the meeting so that the Council is better informed and able to help you.

The Platinum Jubilee of Queen Elizabeth will be celebrated 2nd—5th June 2022 a small budget has been allocated to facilitate community events for everyone to enjoy.

Chinnor Parish Council works within our community to support local services and groups. We have been able to award grants that directly go to organisations and services that provide support for our population.

We also have a number of facilities to support the community, such as the Community Pavilion, Hill Road Recreation Ground and Whites Field Community Hall.
